MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JAIME

Grace and peace to you, Bethlehem Lutheran Church!

For the past few weeks and for the next few weeks all our second readings in worship come from 1 Corinthians. Some of these passages may be quite familiar to you. Paul writes to the church in Corinth about spiritual gifts, the unity we share in the body of Christ, and the need for love in all that we do. We are each gifted with unique gifts and make up a vital part of Christ’s body in the world. In sharing and embodying these gifts however, if we do it without love, it means nothing. As Paul continues in chapter 13, he describes love this way:

“⁴Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant ⁵or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; ⁶it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. ⁷It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸Love never ends... And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.”

As we begin a month which is often bursting with a commercialized “love”, let us take a moment to reflect on this love as described in this first letter to the Corinthians. This love is not envious, boastful, arrogant, or rude. This love is patient and kind. It bears all, believes all, hopes all, and endures all. This love is expansive and powerful but not abrasive, rather embracive. Where do you witness this love in action? When and how do you experience this kind of love? How do you embody this love in all that you do?

Let us turn back to the ultimate example of this love in Christ Jesus and may we all embody this love in all that we do. Because this love is something we all need, ourselves, our community, and our world.

The ELCA South-Central Synod of Wisconsin is welcoming the return of their Leadership, Education and Development Day, “LEAD,” event which will take place on **February 26, 2022** from 8:30 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. at St Luke’s Church in Middleton.

This year, the theme and keynote relates to John 15:11, with the focus on the complexity of joy in troubled times and how the currencies and gifts God has given us can nurture this joy. Here are the current needs:

- Furniture: dining tables (with or without chairs), small to medium couches, living room chairs, dressers, end/bedside/tv tables, floor and table lamps, area rugs, and bunkbeds
- Appliances: small-to-medium flat-screen TVs, microwaves, good vacuums.
- Housewares: sheet sets and mattress pads (for twin & double beds), twin blankets, new pillows, pots & pans, large cooking pots, skillet, 13-gallon trash bins and small first-aid kits.
