## MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JAIME

Greetings to you,

The season of Lent is nearly upon us. In previous years you may remember referring to Lent as a journey and indeed we travel with Jesus these 40 days as we tell Christ’s story and remember all that he gave up for us. All of us.

With any journey, we often get caught up in the movement of travel, but a journey is about more than just the path we take, it is also about the places we land. The places we find ourselves. This Lent we will be focusing on place through the theme of our Lenten series, “You Are Here”. In this series, we will take time to reflect on the places where Jesus goes and the places where we are today. To wonder about where the Spirit is and where the Spirit is calling us to. And to remember and trust in the assurance that Rev. Katie Pocalyko writes about, “no matter where you are-death included-God can find you. Any location-including wherever you are right now-can become a place for resurrection.” God is with us here and now in this place and always.

The resources we are using this Lent will help us reflect on the places we are now. The history of these places may include some highs, lows, and flat places in between. During this season, I want to encourage all of us to reflect on the many layers these places hold from what is here now, what has been, and what will be. The language used in worship and the topics covered in our Lenten devotional and Stations of the Cross may name some things that are unexpected. I want to encourage all of us to not tune these things out, but rather to lean in and listen more intently. Let us pay attention to where we are, where Christ is in this place, and where the Spirit is leading.

## ENSURING SUCCESS PROJECT

The Ensuring Success Project was created by the National Honor Society (NHS) students at eAchieve

Academy, based in the Waukesha area. Our fellow member, Carol Oh, is the President of this Chapter of the NHS. Their goal for this project was to help a unique part of their community. Many refugees, mostly from the Middle East, have been migrating to the Milwaukee area. To help these families as most of them have no personal belongings and no money to buy basic necessities, they have partnered with SEA Literacy and the Hanan Refugee Relief Group. Both of these organizations help refugee families learn English, find jobs, and get a successful start in creating a new life here. Through this project they have committed to helping 10 families receive basic household items (the list is down below). Carol would like to ask for our support in helping these families. A donation box has been put out in the narthex to collect items on the list and will be there until March 20<sup>th</sup>. The items being collected can be gently used or new, but due to religious reasons no used silverware can be accepted.

### SUNDAY SCHOOL

## 2022 FIRST COMMUNION 5<sup>TH</sup> GRADE LESSON SCHEDULE

First Communion Parents & Students-

Your student will be spending the weeks during Lent preparing for their First Communion! They will be learning about the sacraments and why we participate in Communion at church. There are some important things to learn and we hope they ask questions! We are planning on in-person classes and at this time still recommend Covid precautions as encouraged in our church setting. Information and schedule:

The students will work on these activities:

1) They will be asked to **read, learn, and share thoughts from the weekly lessons.**

2) They will also learn **the Communion procedures that our church uses as well as the similarities and differences to other churches.**

3) We will also **review some information found in Luther's Small Catechism.**

Each student will also receive a **Communion Handbook** with learning activities for each week's lesson.

### LESSON SCHEDULE – FOR YOUR CALENDAR OR DEVICE!

PLEASE NOTE – Each week's lesson is presented on Sunday morning (regular Sunday School time) and then *repeated* on Wednesday evening. Students only need to attend either the Sunday OR the Wednesday class each week and can mix attendance between Sundays and Wednesdays through Lent to accommodate family schedules. We hope this way that students will have more options and be able to attend all FOUR class sessions and Review day.


